

Professor Sambit Datta



Professor Sambit Datta studied architecture at the School of Architecture, CEPT University. He completed his masters and doctoral studies at the National University of Singapore and the University of Adelaide. His research is focussed on the computational representation and analysis of building and urban typologies in South and Southeast Asia. His research contributions are in the representation and reconstruction of Indic temple architecture, models of vernacular urbanism and the spatial evolution of street networks.

He is Professor of Architecture in the School of Built Environment at Curtin University with a joint appointment in the School of Electrical Engineering and Computing. He is currently an International Visiting Professor at IIT, Kharagpur and Visiting Professor at the Idea Factory, NYUST, Taiwan. He serves as Corresponding Editor (Asia-Pacific) of the Nexus Network Journal on architecture and mathematics and served as secretary of the Association for Computer-Aided Architectural Design Research in Asia, CAADRIA.
